- VII. Polk County Land and Water Legacy Leslie Berckes
 - A. Bond Initiative to appear on ballot Nov. 2
 - On January 12, 2021, the Polk County Board of Supervisors asked The Trust for Public Land, in cooperation with the Nature Conservancy and the Great Outdoors Foundation, to explore potential options to renew dedicated funding for conservation within the county.
 - 2. On June 9, 2021, by Roll Call No. 21-0611, the Polk County Conservation Board requested the Polk County Board of Supervisors to place a \$65.0 million Polk County's Water & Land Legacy general obligation bond on the November 2, 2021 regular county election ballot and recommended bond language.
 - 3. Voters approved similar bond in 2012; this is a plan to renew bond to continue with funding of water quality projects

 - B. Funding Breakdown of \$65 million
 - 1. 38% to water quality (acquisition of land to protect drinking water, dam mitigation)
 - 2. 31% to parks
 - 3. 15% to Land (trails)
 - 4. Remainder dedicated to more detailed projects
