# GREEN STATE CREDIT UNION BEAVERDALE BRANCH WILL RELOCATE TO MERLE HAY ROAD WITH VISIBILITY, ACCESSIBILITY, AND FUNCTIONALITY IN MIND

Green State Credit Union will be closing its branch office at the corner of Beaver Avenue and Urbandale Avenue sometime next year.

Green State is building a new office on the lot where the former Price Chopper building sits, at Merle Hay Road and Aurora Avenue. Green State is also closing an Urbandale location at 7031 Douglas Avenue. The Urbandale and Beaverdale branches will be consolidated in the new building.

In an email to customers, Green State said, "While evaluating our current facilities, we identified challenges relating to visibility, functionality, and accessibility. Additionally, the Beaverdale facility is leased and does not have adequate space for future expansions."

Customers with safe deposit boxes at Beaverdale or Urbandale will receive communications about moving the boxes, as the time near for the opening of the new credit union branch.

# **BEAVER BEND RECONSTRUCTION UNDERWAY**

Work began in mid-April to reconstruct the Beaver Bend intersection at Beaver Avenue and 41st Street. The City of Des Moines has acquired the property where the former Players bar sat and has demolished the building. The intersection was rated as highly dangerous by the Iowa DOT, particularly for northbound traffic having to look to the right at an awkward angle while having to guess whether southbound traffic on Beaver was going to curve on Beaver or go straight on 41st Street. The new design will square off the intersection for northbound traffic, so the sightlines are better. Southbound

traffic will need to put on a blinker and turn right to continue south on 41st Street.

Construction is expected to take much of the summer, with 41st Street being closed a good portion of that time. A detour has been set up. Access to Snookies will be different, with cars exiting through the back of the property on a temporary drive to 42nd Street.

At 2702 Beaver Ave stands an eclectic brick building that has been a centerpiece of downtown Beaverdale since at least 1925. Over the decades, it has housed businesses like Clayton's Variety and Community Pharmacy, whose soda jerk stand is still hinted at by the raised floor in the center of the building where the station once stood.

In 1974, Jamie and Diana Wornson moved their clothing outfitter from Ames into this eclectic space, establishing Back Country as a Beaverdale staple. When they retired, ownership passed to their daughter Lexi and longtime staff member, Jay Kozel, ensuring the neighborhood's legacy of stylish community involvement continued.

For Back Country has always been more than just a clothing store—it's been a hub of neighborhood connection. Whether through the Beaverdale Bluegrass Festival, streetscaping improvements, Whitmer Park enhancements, or the Beaverdale Neighborhood Association, Jay and the Back Country team have been at the heart of making things happen.

Like the Bull & Finch Pub—better known as the inspiration for Cheers—stepping into Back Country meant being greeted by name and enjoying their signature wit, in addition to having staff remember your waist size. Pre-COVID, you might even grab a cold one from the fridge tucked in their backroom.

So from Beaverdale, with love—thank you, Jay and the Back Country team, for decades of style, sidewalk sales, and community spirit. May whatever come next for 2702 Beaver Ave. continue the legacy.

# WOODLAND ENHANCEMENT IS UNDERWAY IN BEAVERDALE PARK

A woodland enhancement project is underway this spring in parts of Beaverdale Park.

The park, located at 34th Street and Adams Avenue, is much larger than the playground and field seen from Adams Avenue. A much larger swath of land to the north and east is heavily wooded and little used.

This spring, heavy equipment has moved in to begin removing invasive plant species such as woody shrubs and plants. Selected trees are also being removed based on their health and in an effort to thin the canopy.

The goal is to provide a healthier woodland and to provide a more inviting area for public use, with clear sightlines to nearby roads and the Interurban Trail.

Funding for the woodland restoration was provided by a grant from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, which Des Moines Parks and Recreation applied for. Work is expected to be completed in late spring or early summer.

This is just the first of many steps to update Beaverdale Park. There will be a fundraising campaign to pay for new playground equipment. The city council will need to approve funding for other park improvements, such as construction of an enclosed park shelter.

# BEAVERDALE MEGA SCRUB EVENT POLK COUNTY RIVER PLACE, 2309 EUCLID AVE. SATURDAY MAY 17, 2025 — 7:00 AM - 1:00 PM

Clear out your large trash items at the City of Des Moines MegaSCRUB on May 17th!

SCRUB stands for SPRING CLEANUP to REDUCE URBAN BLIGHT. It is the City's mission to enhance the City's neighborhoods by allowing residents an opportunity to remove yard waste and debris from homes and yards to reduce the blighted areas within the City. MEGA SCRUB: A SCRUB event with additional, special waste disposal options that is hosted by select neighborhoods within their section of the City.

Each year the BNA partners with the City of Des Moines Public Works team and other Des Moines Neighborhoods to run MegaSCRUB. At MegaSCRUB, Des Moines residents can dump unwanted appliances, electronics, and large trash items for free, as long as they can show proof of Des Moines residency. There are also shredding services offered on site and a hazmat team present to accept hazardous materials.

This year's MegaSCRUB is scheduled for May 17th, from 7am-1pm, at the Polk County River Place (2309 Euclid Ave., Des Moines). The site will shut promptly at 1pm, and there can sometimes be a wait to dump; so, plan to arrive by 12:30pm to ensure your entry into the dumpsite.

# **SCRUB Event Reminders**

- Proof of Residency is required photo id or current utility bill.
- Before each event, please review the SCRUB guidelines.
- While small amounts of trash or tires are accepted, this service is not intended for commercial dumping. Large trucks full of tires or trash will be turned away.
- MEGA SCRUB events now offer Household Hazardous Waste Disposal. (Capacity for hazardous waste drop-off is limited and fills up quickly. Early arrival is advised.)
- SCRUB events are free to Des Moines residents, therefore you may experience longer wait times.

**NOTE:** This service is free, but neighborhood volunteers will be working at the site and collecting freewill donations from residents who use the service. Donations are then split amongst the participating neighborhood associations. We appreciate any donation you would like to give.
