Hi Neighbors,

Fall has always been my favorite season of the year. But for the fact that it's followed by winter, my (and my car's) least favorites season. Fall in Beaverdale is particularly beautiful, I think. I love walking the streets of our neighborhood, with our mature trees and landscaped yards. I take as much inspiration as I can from everyone's plantings and decorations and have tried this year to make our front yard Beaverdaleworthy. As with everything, it's a work in progress.

As I'm writing this president's letter, I'm proud of a particularly seasonal addition to the landscape: **yard signs**. The number and variety of yard signs on display speaks to the engagement and commitment of our neighbors to our community, both close to home and on a broader scale. We're teaching our children a very important lesson – that they have the right and the obligation to participate in the political process. Your BNA Board endeavored to hold a candidate's forum for all running for elected office in this area, but scheduling the event around everything else unfortunately proved impossible.

This year's **Beaverdale Fall Festival**, held September 20 and 21, was again a rousing success. By my estimate (and I was pretty much everywhere in the neighborhood most of the night), Friday's night's crowd was a record-breaker. The rain held off long enough for the longest-ever parade on Saturday morning and wasn't near enough to deter our hardy neighbors and visitors from continuing the celebration well into Saturday night. My thanks to the entire Fall Festival Committee for their tireless work on this neighborhood showcase.

On October 10, we welcomed **Rebuilding Together Greater Des Moines** back to the neighborhood. Thanks to the generosity of **Meredith Corporation, Ashby Park** is now the home of beautiful new playground equipment. This is in addition to the work that started there last year, thanks to a bequest in a neighbor's Will.

Work continues at **Witmer Park**, where we also plan to install new playground equipment and a state of the art bathroom facility. Fundraising for these elements will gear up next year. Business is booming in Beaverdale and we're pleased to welcome several new ones to the neighborhood. **Motley School Tavern** opened this summer in the old Chef's Kitchen space. **Oh! Sushi** opened on October 11 in Joe's Square (where LeJardin used to be) and **Curbin' Cuisine** has taken over the old Goodson's Pizzeria space next to Grounds for Celebration. **Franklin Jr. High** has been and will be the site of a number of events, including concerts, meetings, candidate meet-andgreets and, in February, precinct caucuses.

Fall is a relatively quite time for your BNA Board, giving us some time to "catch up" on busy work. **Tom LaPointe** and **Nick Mertes** are getting ready to launch our membership drive neighborhood canvass. Look for the new Beaverdale Neighborhood Association door hangers. If you've joined or renewed your BNA membership lately, you received (or will) one of our new window clings. Just a little something to say "thanks" for your help funding the work we do.

Our revamped website is up and running, thank to **Brent Millis**. I got my membership renewal reminder for the first time, which I appreciated. I was quite embarrassed to discover I had let my membership lapse for several months last time around (not a good thing for your neighborhood president).

Adam Plagge has started uploading old Sidewalks and other memorabilia to the Beaverdale Neighborhood Association Facebook page. It's our goal to some day have a dozen plastic tubs of documents, photographs, etc. scanned, uploaded and available to the public on our website and social media.

Jay Kozel and Kate Ross are chairing this year's Shop Hop committee. Save December 7, 2019 on your calendars for Shop Hop, a bar crawl and other fun neighborly events.

As I near the end of my second term as president of the Beaverdale Neighborhood Association, I want to extend my thanks and gratitude to all who make this neighborhood what it is: the best darn city in the City of Des Moines.

Jarrod and Misty Fontanini started Curbin' Cuisine in May 2013 with just a food cart at the Beaverdale Farmer's Market and Beaverdale Fall Festival. Over the next several years, Curbin' Cuisine grew more popular and was repeatedly requested by numerous businesses and event coordinators in Des Moines and in surrounding towns. In January 2015 they expanded their business to a fully equipped Food Truck. This allowed them to go to more locations for lunches, dinners, and special events. In 2018 and 2019 they were voted into the Top Three Best of the Best Food Trucks by CityView. In October 2019 their

dream to have a brick and mortar restaurant became a reality. The Fontanini's get to return 'home' to Beaverdale where it all began for them.
