NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH NEWS AND INFORMATION



Many of us have been forced to remain at home during the Covid-19 pandemic. This has resulted in fewer incidents of crime. However, warmer weather means more people out and about. Please remember to close/lock windows and doors if you leave your home, even for a brief period of time. Consider adding surveillance cameras and motion activated lights to your home as part of your overall home protection strategy. The Des Moines Police started a program to register your surveillance camera which enables police to quickly canvas a neighborhood when a crime occurs. The program is completely voluntary. watchdsm.php. Additionally, CrimeMapping is a website that provides information about crimes in our neighborhood. You can enter your address to view crimes that have occurred within the vicinity of your home. Crime data is updated daily and you can view up to 180 days of prior data. See https://www.crimemapping.com/ for more information. Lastly, per city ordinance, vehicles parked on residential streets cannot be parked for longer than 24 hours. Call police non-emergency number to report incidents (515 283-4811). Inoperable cars parked on city streets, junk/debris or vehicles parked in front yards can be reported to Neighborhood Inspection Zoning Division at 515 283-4046.

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BEAVERDALE BEAUTIFICATION DURING COVID-19

The BNA Beautification Committee is still trying to be active during these strange times. 

HOORAY FOR CURB REPLACEMENT!!!ALONG AMICK FROM BEAVER TO 38TH STREET

The City of Des Moines is planning to replace the curbs along Amick Ave. from Beaver Ave. to 38th St. This work will be funded by the City's Capital Improvement Program Budget and you will NOT be assessed for this project.

Construction of the curbs along Amick Ave. is scheduled to take place during the 2020 construction season. During construction, mail and solid waste collection services will be continued. Lane closures along the project will be required for the curb construction. The new curbs will be placed between existing driveways. Driveways will not be reconstructed and will remain open during construction.

The contractor will be replacing short sections of curb at a time to minimize the amount of construction disruption adjacent to the brick roadway. After the curbs are placed, they will be backfilled and seeded. As short sections are complete, the contractor will continue down the road until they complete all the curb replacement.

Another notice will be hand-delivered when the work is scheduled to begin. 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10 FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT NFC LOANS

BEAVERDALE RESIDENTS NOW ELIGIBLE FOR NFC FORGIVABLE LOANS

Neighborhood Finance Corp. (NFC) is a non-profit, licensed mortgage lender, providing unique home loans and lending programs to facilitate neighborhood revitalization in Polk County. Beginning January 2, 2020, Beaverdale residents became eligible for Neighborhood Finance Corp. (NFC) loans. This means that people looking to buy a home in Beaverdale can finance their home purchase through NFC, and existing Beaverdale residents can refinance their current mortgages through NFC. In addition, residents can apply for home improvement loans, a portion of which will be forgivable over time. Here are 10 important pieces of information you should know, before applying for an NFC loan:

- 1) There are no income limitations for the NFC program. So long as applicants have adequate credit, anyone can be considered for an NFC forgivable loan, regardless of income level. It is not solely for low income individuals.
- 2) There are no home assessment value limitations for the NFC program. Regardless of how large or small your Beaverdale home is, if your home is owner-occupied, you are eligible to apply for NFC financing. If you own multiple properties, there may be further restrictions.
- 3) The portion of your loan that is forgivable will range anywhere from 25% to 50% of the total renovation project amount, up to a maximum of \$10,000 in forgivable money. Income level will

determine that portion of your loan which is forgivable, but even a millionaire could get at



least 25% of his loan as forgivable, so long as he meets all of NFC's loan requirements. 20% of the forgivable loan will be written off ("forgiven") each year, over a 5-year period.

- 4) You needn't refinance your house, or obtain a new purchase loan, in order to obtain a forgivable loan. While NFC provides both of these forms of financing, you can apply solely for a home improvement or Front Porch Exterior loan and receive a portion of that loan in forgivable money. If you know someone wanting to purchase a home, let them know about NFC's Neighborhood Reinvest down payment assistance program.
- 5) The list of eligible home improvement projects is fairly extensive. Whether your project is big or small, it makes sense to check out the program. Home additions/expansions, kitchen and/or bath remodels, new garages, driveway and HVAC system replacements, and flooring upgrades all count. (Just to name a few--the list goes on and on.) A handful of improvements are ineligible, such as decorative landscaping, hot tubs and swimming pools. If you are considering a home improvement and wonder whether it would be NFC-eligible,

CITY SEWER & YOUR PROPERTY

SUBSIDIES FOR PROPERTY PROTECTION PROGRAMS







The rain storm on July 1, 2018 that overwhelmed the storm sewer caused heartache for many Beaverdale residents. It brought our antiquated sewer to the fore front and demanded action by the city. The city is working hard to lay out plans to fix the sewer infrastructure and it is offering programs that subsidizes the cost for property protection devices and a program to help reduce storm water run-off.

The first program offers subsidies to help defray the cost for installing property protection devices such as sump pumps and backwater valves:

The Private Property Protection Program:

This program provides a subsidy to property owners in Des Moines who contract with a licensed plumber to redirect one or more eligible sources of infiltration and inflow to an outlet other than the sanitary sewer system or to install a backwater valve on private sewer service to protect against surcharges on the public sewer system.

With this program, the City will make a Private Property Protection Program subsidy reimbursement for 100% of the cost up to \$1,500 to the property owners who meet the requirements of the program. The reimbursement for approved work will be by direct payment to the property owner. Qualifying work eligible for funding include:

- The installation or redirection of a sump pump to discharge flows from foundation drains and area drains to a non-sanitary sewer outlet such as a rain garden, storm sewer, or the ground surface.
- The disconnection of roof leaders from the sanitary sewer service
- The installation of backwater valve.

Additionally, the city needs our help to reduce storm water runoff that enters the sewer. In order to do this, the city is offering the following program:

Stormwater Best Management Practices Program:

This program will provide a rebate to property owners who install stormwater best management practices to help to enhance the water quality of the stormwater runoff and/or decrease the amount of runoff that enters the stormwater drainage system.

With this program, the City will make a rebate reimbursement for 50% of the cost up to \$2,000 to property owners who meet the requirements of the program. The reimbursement for approved work will be by direct payment to the property owner in the amount of the qualifying work. Qualifying work eligible for funding:

- Bio-retention cells
- Rain Gardens
- Permeable pavement
- Rain barrels

- Streambank stabilization
- Soil Quality Restoration
- Other similar practices approved by the director

- 6) NFC does not finance sweat equity. For your project to be eligible for a forgivable loan, the work must be performed by a licensed contractor, and he/she must have pulled the necessary permits. Please ask for further information if you are a licensed contractor.
- 7) Work on your project cannot begin until after you have closed on your NFC loan. NFC does not finance projects already under construction. So, if you wish to apply for a forgivable loan, it is important to wait until after your loan has been approved to start your project.
- 8) NFC will provide a forgivable loan up to \$10,000 every 10 years for every eligible property. So, if you or someone living in your home received a NFC Advantage Loan in the past 10-years, contact NFC to see if there are forgivable loan funds available. NFC's Front Porch Exterior home improvement loan does not have to be paired with a forgivable loan and may be an option if forgivable loan funds are not currently available.
- 9) A small geographic region of Beaverdale, the area formerly known as Meredith Neighborhood, will not be eligible for NFC Lending as of June 30, 2020 (this may be extended to Dec. 31, 2020). This area has been eligible since 2015 and is rotating off the NFC eligibility list.
