Beaverdale is hosting it's Garden Walk once again and inviting garden lovers to our neighborhood to explore a few of our gardens. We have 6 new gardens and are also returning to a garden we first experienced in 2007. It will be interesting to see what time has changed. Other gardens will feature a hand built pergola covered with wisteria, an outdoor screening room with it's own refrigerator, a wooden castle turned garden shed, beautiful paved pathways, and lots of pollinator friendly native plants. Neighborhood Finance Corporation (NFC) has been providing purchase, refinance, and home improvement renovations in the Des Moines area for over 30 years. Since NFC started lending in Beaverdale, they have provided loans to over 529 households totaling over \$29 million in repayable and forgivable loans in our neighborhood.

Our neighborhood is in a NFC lending area which means you may apply for an NFC Advantage Loan and qualify for a forgivable loan of up to \$10,000 in home renovations. The forgivable loan is available when first qualifying for a purchase, refinance, or home improvement loan. In addition, some home buyers may qualify for up to \$10,500 in down payment assistance.

If you are considering exterior repairs or improvements, ask NFC about their Front Porch Program loans. These loans are available for

## **PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENTS** Q & A WITH THE POLK COUNTY ASSESSOR

#### Why did the assessor mail me a new assessment notice earlier in April?

In Iowa, assessors are required by law to reassess all property in their jurisdiction every odd-numbered year. It's our statutory duty and responsibility. To maximize fairness and understandability, Iowa law requires assessments to be based on current market value.

#### Reassessments are intended to raise revenue for local governments, right?

No, that's a common misconception; reassessments are not intended to raise revenue. Most property assessments remain "frozen" during the two years between reassessments, while the market fluctuates within that twoyear period. Reassessments are intended to allow the assessor to get in sync with the market since the last reassessment, thereby improving appraisal performance which in turn improves tax equity.

#### Why did my assessment go up so much?

The real estate market in Polk County was very strong since our last reassessment in 2019. Demand far outpaced supply due to having more potential buyers in the market than homes for sale, thus creating a heavy seller's market. Mortgage interest rates were historically low. These factors caused the strong increase we experienced in the market. Changes in property values vary depending on: location, any physical changes made to a property, and overall sales per market area. This 2021 reassessment reflects changes in market value over the last two years.

#### Will my taxes go up because of the assessor's reassessment?

The total tax burden is determined by the local taxing authorities, NOT the assessor. Assessors are responsible for the allocation of the property tax burden, not the magnitude of the tax. If you are concerned about your taxes increasing, I recommend getting involved and participating in the budget process for your school, city, county, and the other taxing entities. The budget process starts in January of each year. The outcome of those budget processes early next year will determine the magnitude of the tax that you will pay based on your 2021 assessment.

#### When will I pay taxes based on the 2021 assessments?

Looking at the timeline, property is assessed for taxation each year. Also, each odd-numbered year shall be a reassessment year. Assessment year 2021 begins on January 1, 2021 and property taxes paid on that assessment are for the fiscal tax year from 07/01/2021 through 06/30/2022. Taxes are payable in arrears beginning with the first half payment on 09/30/2022 and the second half payment on 03/31/2023.

## HOW DOES EXERCISE BOOST IMMUNITY? SPONSORED BY EDENCREST AT BEAVERDALE

# Now more than ever, seniors are looking for methods of boosting their Immunity. Let's take a closer look at the #1 recommended method - Exercise.

**Improved Immune Response:** People typically have a limited number of immune cells circulating throughout their body. These cells tend to "hang out" in the lymphoid tissues and organs like the spleen, where they kill viruses, bacteria and other microorganisms which cause disease.

According to a 2019 scientific review in the Journal of Sport & Health Science, because exercise increases circulation of blood, it also increases the circulation of immune cells, causing them to roam the body at a higher rate and at higher numbers.

Think of exercising as you do housecleaning: If you vacuum your home for the first time in months, your home will look better than if you never vacuumed. However, if you started vacuuming thereafter 3 times a week, your home will get cleaner and cleaner each time you vacuum.

**<u>Reduced Inflammation</u>**: Another benefit of exercise is that it decreases inflammation in the body—which, in turn, can also improve



immunity. In fact, some research, like the 2004 study in the Journal of the American Geriatrics Society, links decreased levels of inflammatory markers to those that exercise more often and have higher fitness levels. Nieman says that goes hand-in-hand with immunity. "When immune cells try to function with inflammation, it puts the immune system in a chronically



inflamed state too," he says, which makes it harder to fight infection. Exercise naturally assists the body in fighting inflammation.

"Exercise really is a housekeeping activity, where it helps the immune system patrol the body and detect and evade bacteria and viruses," says study author David Nieman.
