BLOCK CHALLENGE GRANT PROGRAMNFC FORGIVABLE LOANS ARE STILL AVAILABLE!

The City of Des Moines has partnered with Invest DSM, a nonprofit organization, to administer the Block Challenge Grant Program (the "BCG Program"). The BCG Program works to strengthen Des Moines neighborhoods by encouraging groups of neighbors to work together on exterior improvements to their properties. Funding is available to assist between 100-150 program participants or 10-30 teams. A 50% matching grant of up to \$2,500 per project, depending on team size and location within the City, will be provided to property owners as incentive to complete various exterior improvements to their properties.

Project Purpose: Neighbors uniting to build community, neighborhood identity, and improve the appearance of Des Moines' neighborhoods.

Project Goals:

- Improve the exterior physical condition of the properties located within the City of Des Moines.
- Bring neighbors together to build a sense of community pride.
- Create momentum for larger, more impactful property improvements.

Project Eligibility (abbreviated):

- At least five (5) residential neighbors must apply as a team.
- Properties must be within the City of Des Moines.
- Each team member applicant must be the owner of the property.
- Contract buyers are eligible (*with validation).
- Renters are eligible if the property owner signs with consent.
- Property taxes must be current or in good standing.
- Each property must also be within eyesight from the front door of another participating property included in the applicant team.
- Improvements must meet eligibility criteria and design standards.
- A complete application must be submitted and approved by the City
 of Des Moines prior to improvements being made. Costs expended
 by a team member before the team's application is submitted and
 approved by City staff are not eligible for reimbursement.

Applications for the Block Grant Challenge Program will be accepted July 1 through September 30 from neighborhood teams wanting to make exterior home improvements of all sizes, from a new mailbox to an addition or a new garage. THE BRAIN-CHANGING EFFECTS OF EXERCISE SPONSORED BY EDENCREST AT BEAVERDALE

By now, we've all heard it: 'Exercise is the most transformative thing you can do for your brain.' According to The Brain Changing Benefits of Exercise (a recent TED talk by Dr. Wendy A. Suzuki), exercise is beneficial to brain health for the following three reasons:

- 1. It has immediate effects on your brain. A single workout will immediately increase levels of neurotransmitters, which boosts your mood immediately after the workout.
- 2. A single workout can increase your ability to focus your attention and that improvement will last for at least two hours following the workout.
- 3. A single workout will improve your reaction times, which can help you to prevent accidents and injuries.

These immediate effects can translate to long-term benefits by simply continuing to exercise on a regular basis. The effects are long-lasting because regular exercise actually changes the brain's anatomy, physiology and function.

Regular exercise creates new brain cells in the hippocampus, which increases its' volume. Long term exercise produces improved attention



function in your prefrontal cortex, and those neurotransmitters that help increase your mood will continue to be produced on an ongoing basis if you continue to exercise regularly. The most transformative effect that exercise has is in the protective effects it has on your brain. Here, you can think of your brain as a muscle. The more you are working out, the bigger and stronger your hippocampus and prefrontal cortex becomes. Which is great news, because the prefrontal cortex and the hippocampus are the two areas in the brain that are the most susceptible to neurodegenerative disease and normal cognitive decline in aging. So, with increased exercise over a lifetime, you're not going to cure dementia or Alzheimer's disease, but you are going to create a larger and stronger hippocampus and prefrontal cortex so that it takes longer for these diseases to have an effect on your daily life.

The good news from all this research is that these brain-changing effects of exercise can be achieved through a very do-able exercise regime: three or four 30-minute exercise sessions per week.

Beaverdale Community Immunity Cards are not available to those who have already completed their vaccine course. Only those receiving their final COVID vaccine shot from this point forward will be eligible to receive a card.

Please note that the cards will not contain any personal information, nor will the participating businesses or BNA be collecting any personal information as part of this effort.
